Former Sowerby Bridge Railway Station workers Harold G M Wainwright (1933 -)

Harold joined British Railways on 18 March 1954 and he became a well-known figure on the Calder Valley Line in the early 1960s.

On 7 December 1960 (three weeks before his 28th birthday) Harold was appointed as Station Master at Mytholmroyd. At that time the

station was much busier than it is today; as well as commuters and other passengers, it also handled regular freight and parcels traffic, including prolific quantities of Thornbers day old chicks.

In early 1962 Harold was also asked to assume control of Luddendenfoot Station and he was Station Master there until its closure on Sunday 9 September 1962. As Harold states "Branwell Bronte was the first Station Master at Luddendenfoot and I have the dubious honour of being the last". Harold spent his time between the two stations; during the day he was at Mytholmroyd and in the evening he attended to the administration at Luddendenfoot.

After a short period at Healey Mills, Harold returned to the Calder Valley on 1 June 1964 as Station Master at Sowerby Bridge and remained in the role for approximately seven months. At the time there were impressive gardens at the station, but British Railways didn't provide funds to maintain them. The funds for new plants and gardening equipment were obtained by 'acquiring' a fairly large quantity of rusty cast iron drain piping (that had been left in the sidings by the Engineer's Department) and selling it to a local scrap metal merchant.

Harold has many fond memories of his time in the Calder Valley and he particularly remembers the 13 April 1962 when he became the Calder Valley Open Snooker Champion and, in the same evening, his wife gave birth to his first child, Janet. Harold retired in March 1993 after 39 years' railway service. He currently resides in Derby and is a Life Member of The Friends of Sowerby Bridge Railway Station.
